

Stu McDonald Wins for Tanners

Stu McDonald, skipper of the Tanners, led his team to a 6-5 victory over the Raiders in a scheduled Wednesday contest, Friday night. It was their eighth straight win.

One of the smallest crowds of the season braved the sub-zero temperatures to see the clear-cut games of the season. Stu McDonald's hot trick paved the way for the Tanners who had to contend with big Bob Dobbie's three goal Flyer performance.

Only one penalty was handed out in the first two periods, but eight penalties trooped to the penalty box in the third period from a total in the last 10 seconds.
