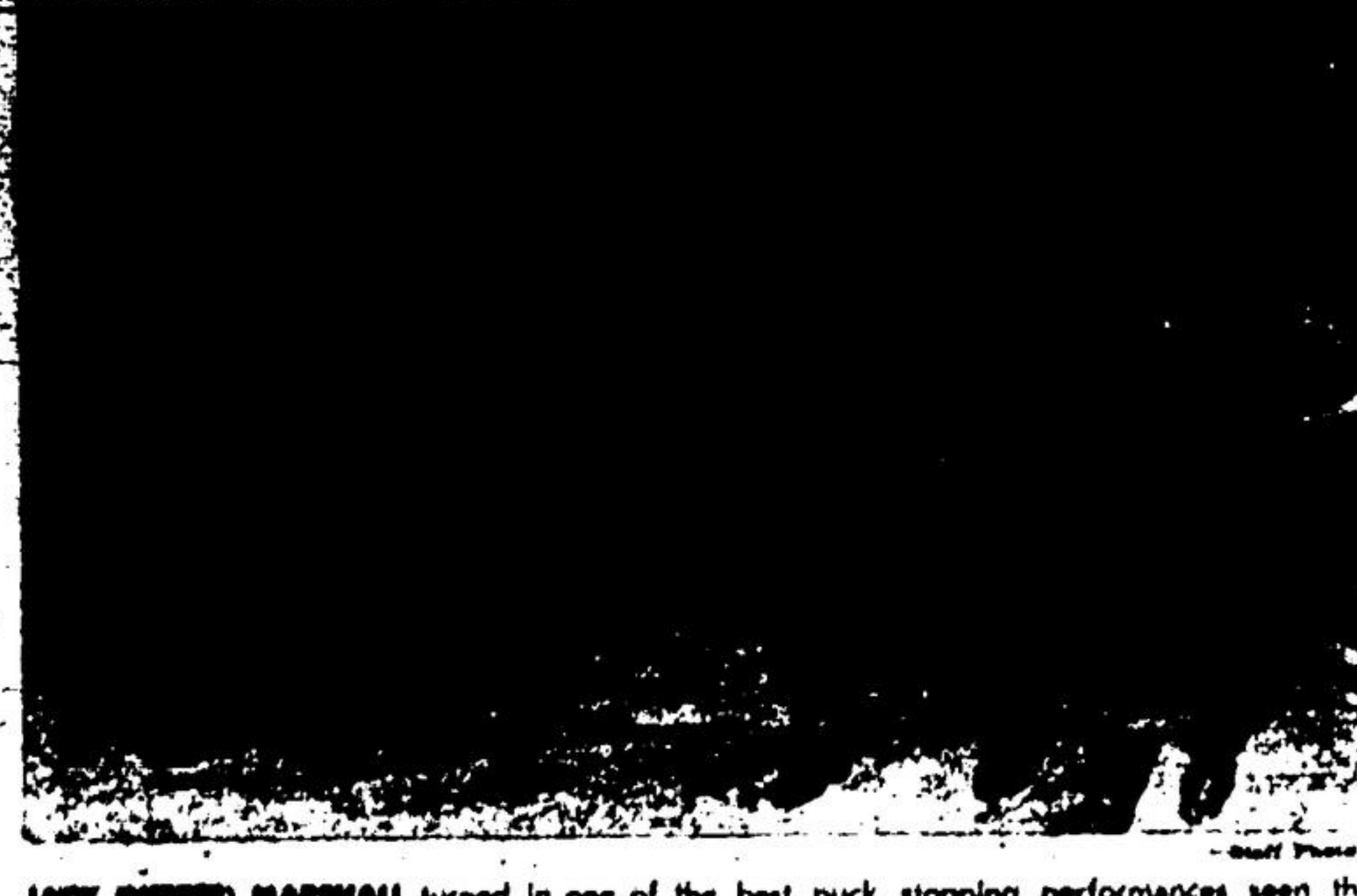

Intercounty Bowling

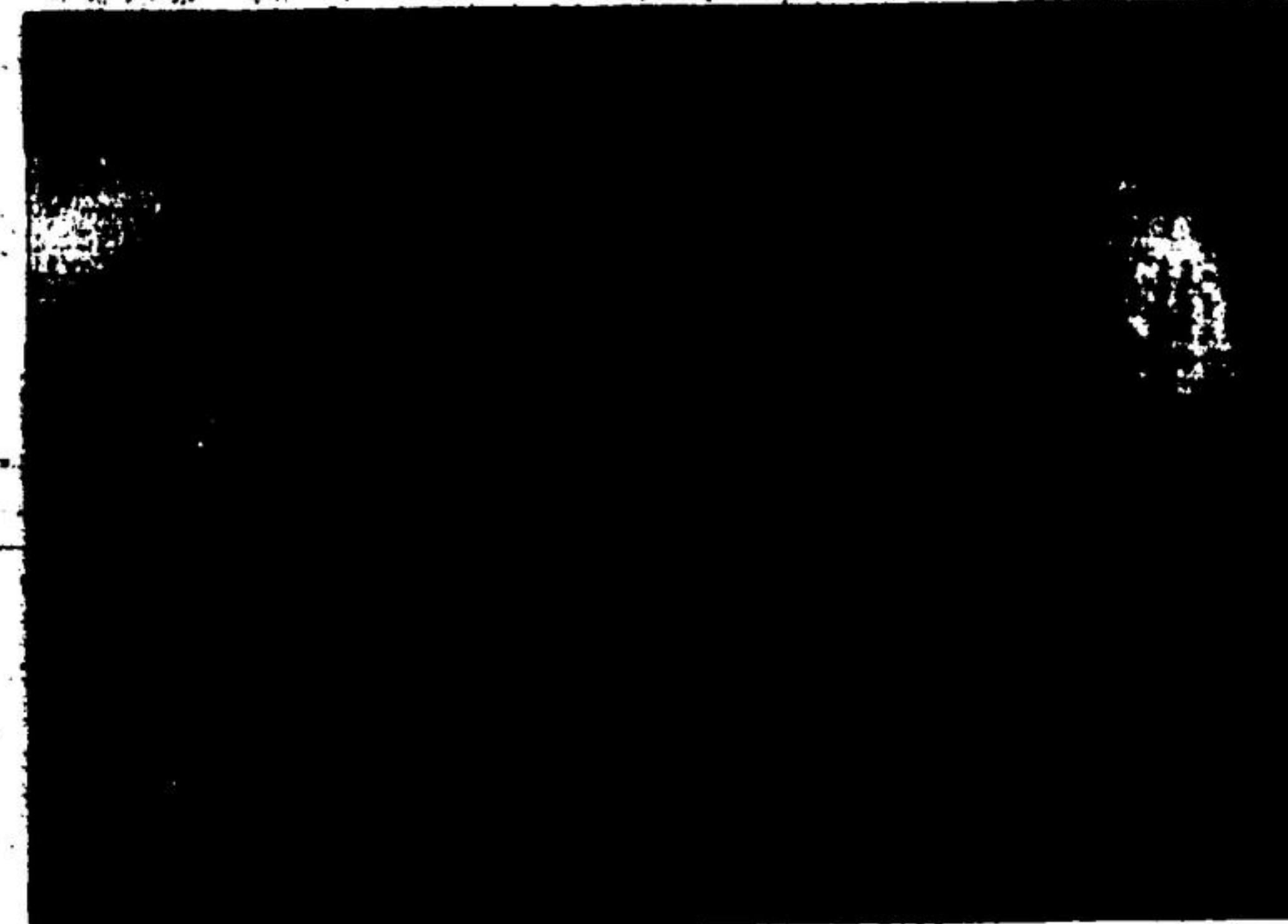

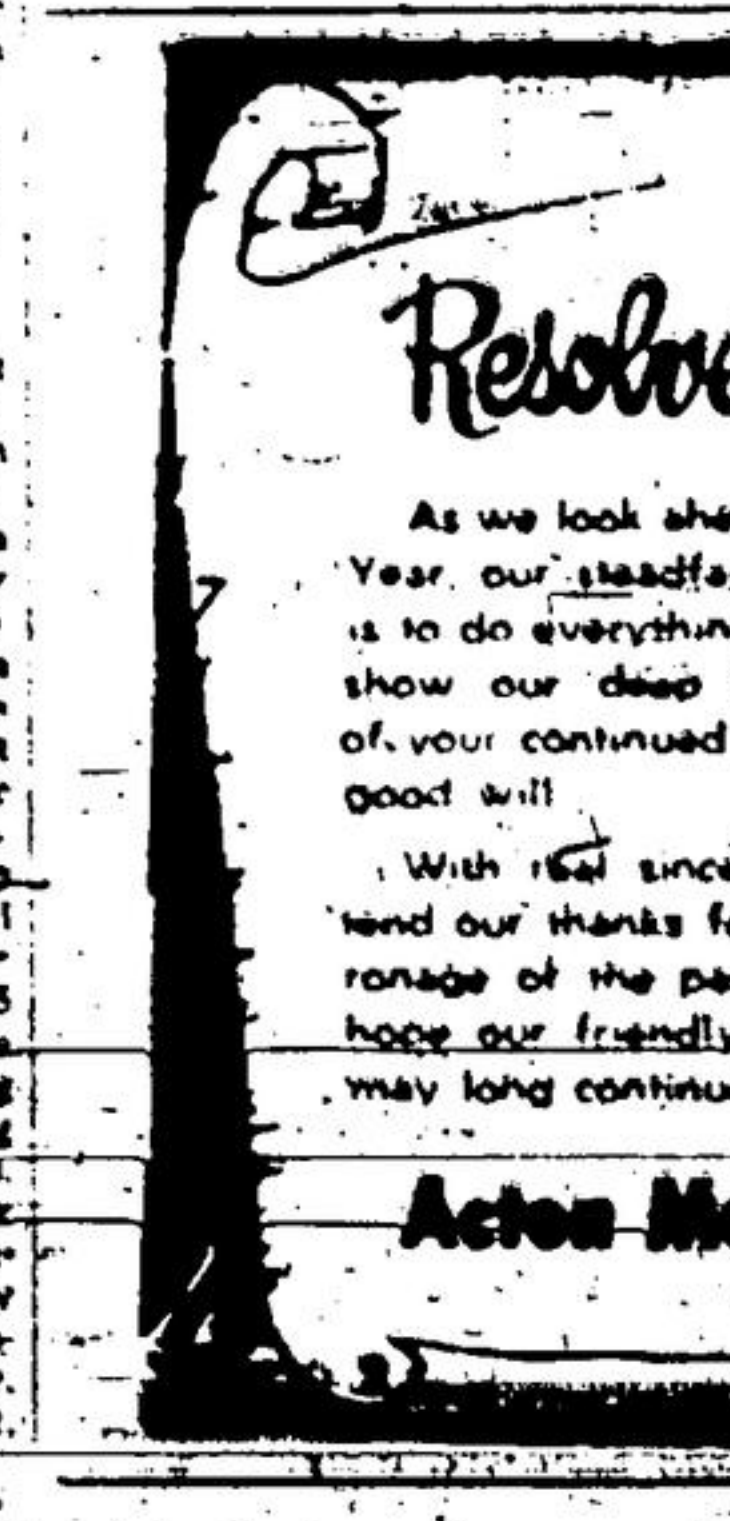
