RECIPE OF THE MONTH

Recipe for Sausage Peacherino. Text includes: 'Sausage Peacherino Serves 5 Easy and Economical. 1 lb. sausage meat, 1/2 table spoon minced onion, 2 cups soft bread crumbs, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1/2 teaspoon poultry seasoning, dash of pepper, 1 egg, beaten, 10 canned anchovies, 1/2 teaspoon peach halves drained, whole cloves, 1 cup peach syrup.' Instructions: 'Combine sausage, onion, bread crumbs, egg and seasoning. Form into ten balls. Bake in shallow pan in moderate oven (350 deg. F.) 25 minutes. Remove from oven. Drain off fat. Drain peach halves and stud with 4-6 cloves. Place a sausage ball on top of each peach half. Add syrup and return to oven for 20 minutes, basting with syrup.'
