Bilingual Model Parliament At Brampton H.S. on Saturday

Thirteen secondary schools of Peel and Halton counties, and two Quebec high schools, St. Laurent and Brebeuf high schools sent representatives to the first bilingual model parliament of this area, held at Brampton high school on Saturday, February 22.

It was a full day of activity for all concerned. Registration began at 9 a.m.; political caucus meetings were over at 10:30; the House went into session at 10:45. Mrs. Connie Armstrong, chairman of the Board of Education, Brampton, read the Speech from the Throne, both in English and in French.

Minister Speaks
At luncheon, some 200 people heard Wm. Davis, Minister of Education, address the students on the problem of "Unemployment". He called upon the youth of today to take the initiative in helping the less fortunate in underdeveloped countries, for he added, "The people of today know that they can have a better world". Mr. Davis welcomed the Quebec visitors, stating that it was coincidental that their visits should coincide with the visit of Premier Lesage of Quebec.

In the course of his address Mr. Davis reminded the young parliamentarians that any policies adopted should be stable. "Young people accept change easily," he said, "and change for the sake of change should be based on a sound policy."

OK Federal Education
The afternoon session saw the two resolutions presented by the party in power, the Dominion party, passed. Their chief proposal was that a Federal Ministry of Education be set up to have national jurisdiction in education. A further proposal was to establish trade missions in Communist countries, and to maintain the present civil structure with the United States.

Georgetown High School won the trophy for best performance, both in the conducting of their election campaign, and in the presenting of their party policies during the session.

Representatives from Acton High School were Tom McKeown, leader of the Dominion party for the local group and the other Dominion members, Carol Strackhamer, Gay White, Margie MacKenzie and Axel Nieszczeri.

Don Long, Whip of the Opposition, and David Lidka were delegates for the Nationalist party.
