Announce 1964 Fish Seasons

Calling all anglers — it's time to start looking out the fishing gear!

The following list of 1964 fishing seasons and angling licenses was announced this week for the Lake Huron district. The district includes Halton County.

FISH SEASONS
Trout — speckled, brown, rainbow, May 1 to September 15.
Rainbow trout extended to November 30 in Great Lakes and portions of some rivers running into the Great Lakes.

Pike — May 15 to March 31.
Pickeredil — May 16 to April 14.
Largemouth and smallmouth black bass — June 27 to November 30.

ANGLING LICENCES
Non-resident — entire season, \$2.50.
Non-resident 3 consecutive days, \$3.25.
Resident — Provincial Parks (only) Algonquin, Quince, Lake Superior, \$3.25.

Anglers must have a licence on one licence in any one year. Licences may be obtained from their person while angling. Licences are not transferable.

LIMITS OF CATCH
Largemouth smallmouth bass, or any combination thereof — six in one day.
Pike — six in one day.
Pickeredil — six in one day.
Rainbow — five in one day.
Brown trout — five in one day.
Speckled trout — ten pounds plus one fish or 15 fish, whichever is the lesser.

Unattended or set lines are illegal.
Only one line per person is permitted for angling in open water. Two lines are allowed when ice fishing.
Unbaited hooks must not be used to take fish except when artificial lures are used for casting or trolling.

Tyler Hearing In Town Hall

F. J. Schoniker, chairman of the Ontario Highway Transport Board, and a board member J. Graham heard 39 witnesses testify in favor of granting a class "A" license to Tyler Transport during a two-day hearing in the town hall, Monday and Tuesday.

Opposing the license were Gov. Transport, Consolidated Transport, Inter City Transport, Direct Winters Transport and MacAnally Transport.
All transport companies in opposition were represented by counsel as well as the applicant. Yesterday afternoon (Wednesday) a private hearing was held in Toronto at the office of Mr. Schoniker in order to hear opposition judgment will be handed down at a later date.
Earlier Gov. Transport had made application for the same type of license between Acton and Toronto but judgment has not been received to date.
