

# TOWN OF ACTON AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Council and Ratepayers  
of the Town of Acton, Ontario.

Dear Sirs:

We have made an examination of the books and accounts of the Town of Acton and its Associated Boards and Commissions for the year ended December 31, 1963. Our examination has been conducted in accordance with the auditing instructions of the Department of Municipal Affairs and there is attached a completed questionnaire covering this.

The Statement of Revenue and Expenditure "D" shows a surplus on the year's operations of \$9,202.92. A detailed comparison of the gains and losses from the budget figures is attached, showing how the surplus occurred.

Statement P3 "Operations of the Water Department" shows that department had a surplus of \$3,315.42. This surplus occurred because the levy of \$14,215.00 for water deficit was in excess of actual operating costs of the Water Department. It should be considered in any provision for 1964 Water deficit.

Statement A shows the debt to the Ontario Water Resources Commission at \$173,851.00. We have been unable as yet to obtain confirmation of this amount or of the accumulated reserves.

### AUDITOR'S OPINION

Subject to the qualifications regarding the debt to the Ontario Water Resources Commission, we hereby report that in our opinion:

(1) The financial transactions which have come under our notice have been within the powers of the Municipality.

(2) The audit has been conducted in accordance with the instructions of the Department of Municipal Affairs.

(3) The financial statements present fairly the financial position of the Municipality as at December 31, 1963 and the results of its operations for the year ended on that date.

### High School

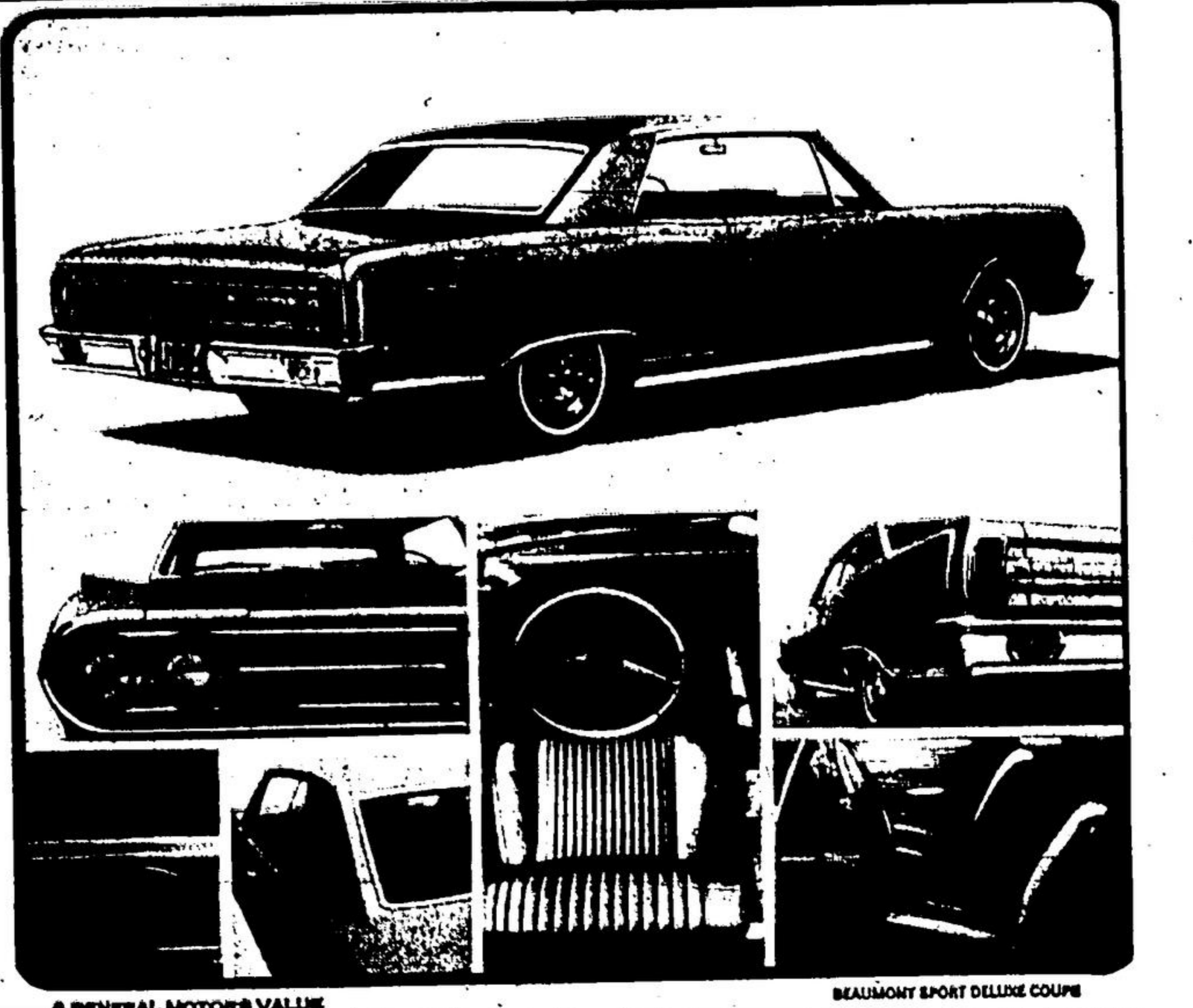
