Word has been received from several parts of Central and South America regarding the Bible.

"Dialogue with Jesus" is the title of a new selection of Scripture passages recently published in Venezuela. Using John, chapters 14 and 15, the booklet was printed in Spanish. A half million of these selections are being used in the visitation campaign of Evangelism-in-Depth in Venezuela this Spring.

"The Light of the Amazon" is the name of the Bible Society's book which recently completed a month-long tour during which 65,000 Scripture portions were distributed. The Society in Brazil reports a nation-wide distribution of over five million copies in 1963.

The Book of the Month in Central America, in January, was the Gospel of Mark. Promoted by the Bible Societies, the object is to get people to read the Scriptures more systematically. The fact that the various Books of the Bible are available in various languages and versions is advertised widely in connection with this project.
