New Abattoir At Reformatory

A \$237,559 contract was awarded to Len Ariss & Co. Ltd., Guelph, by Public Works Minister Ray Connell to build the new abattoir at the Guelph Ontario Reformatory. Eight major contracting firms bid for the job. Mr. Connell said the 180 by 120-foot structure would replace an outmoded abattoir which has been operated at this institution for more than 30 years.

The abattoir, when completed will handle about 300 head of cattle and swine per week. Meat will be used in southwestern Ontario institutions of the Department of Health and Reform.

The building will contain large killing and inspection areas and holding pens for cattle brought to the site in advance of slaughter. Hide handling rooms, storage and mechanical equipment will be in the basement.

The Works Minister said farmers in the area will greatly appreciate the construction of this abattoir as it means another valuable outlet for livestock.
