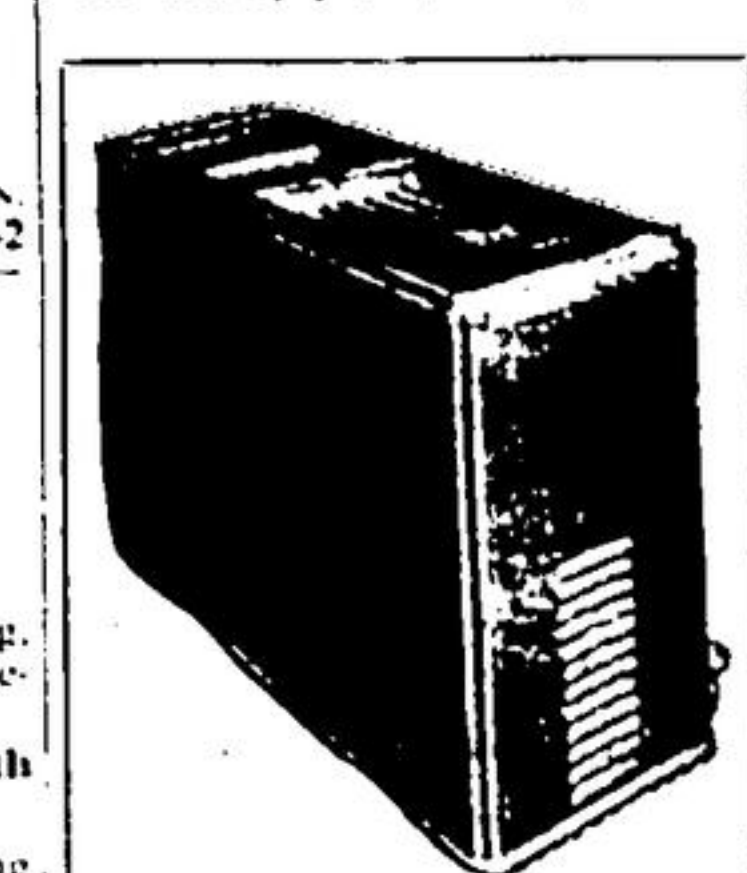
**Family Celebration On 80th Birthday**
