The new facilities will require extensive use of instructional communication media and Mr. Moore has been called to develop this program.

Mr. Moore will also have a teaching responsibility in the university's Department of Religion, as well as instructing professors on the use of closed circuit television and overhead and rear screen projection techniques.

A graduate of the University of Western Ontario, Emmanuel College, Victoria University and Syracuse University, Mr. Moore was ordained by the London Conference of the United Church of Canada in 1955. He has served churches in Kitchener, Saskatoon, Rockwood and Port Dover. Ont. In addition, he has been active with the United Church's Berkeley Studio as an Educational Consultant.
