Open Kelso Dam Area In Saturday Ceremony

In a ceremony at 2 p.m. Saturday afternoon, the new Kelso Conservation Area will be officially opened and dedicated, when T. R. Hilliard, Deputy Minister of Energy and Resources Management, unveils a plaque commemorating the event.

Hundreds of special guests have been invited to attend the ceremony, and the general public is also welcome to attend.

The 16 Mile Creek Conservation Area and this Authority has this year been merged with the 12 Mile Creek Authority to form the Halton Region Conservation Authority. The area features a large dam holding back an 85-acre lake, swimming pool and wading pool, picnic areas and some excellent scenery, and is also the site of Halton County Museum and the Glen Eden Ski Club.

Seven Receptionists Conservation Authority employees Pat Hull, Gloria Penuscello, Marlene Griffin, and Margaret Judy Abel, Mary Jean Coulson, Pat Coulson and Jane Maxwell will be official receptionists for Saturday's ceremony.

A. S. L. Barnes, head of the Conservation Branch, Department of Energy and Resources, will plant an eight-foot white birch tree, and Authority chairman Ralph Sherwood will explain an erosion demonstration project and place the last sod of a new grass waterway in place. Dr. C. A. Martin, vice-chairman of the Authority, is to be chairman for the afternoon proceedings.
