KEEP PLASTIC BAGS OUT OF BABY'S CRIB
 Three Ontario youngsters have suffocated from thin plastic film to date this summer, reports the Ontario Safety League. This hazard continues to cause death among children particularly during the summer months, and the league once again pleads for parents that children come in contact with plastic bags through adult carelessness.
 The most common situation leading to these accidents is where a mother mistakenly substitutes a thin plastic bag for a proper crib mattress cover. Late-ly, however, more children are found the bags around their homes and pulling them over their heads.
 In either case, if plastic bags were tied in knots and safely discarded, never re-used where there are children in the house, these deaths would not happen.

Wood Control News
 One-eye Daisy and the Hawthorns, which include Orange Hawthorn and King Devil, are perennials that have spread to this county from Europe and the Field Crops Branch of the Ontario Department of Agriculture states that they are especially troublesome in pastures and hay-fields, which cannot be plowed and brought under a short crop rotation.
 One-eye Daisy, a relative of the chrysanthemum has short, thick root stalks which show great vitality, with many stems growing from one root. The plant grows from six inches to three feet in height and the flowers, which are quite attractive, are one to two inches across with bright yellow centres and white edges. Even woods can be beautiful. In fact I have known housewives who had such admiration for the plants and transplant them in their favorite flower gardens.
 Orange Hawthorn is often called Devil's Pasture because of its bright coloured flowers borne in clusters on the top of a nearly leafless stem that grows from twice to eighteen inches high. This weed is a real pest in permanent pastures in Northern Ontario.
 King Devil is a tree-like shrub in Eastern Ontario. It is like Orange Hawthorn but may be distinguished by its small, yellow flowers.
 All these weeds are easily killed by cultivation. Late-sown hay and pasture fields should be plowed if possible, and put under a short rotation of crops. Chemical weed killers should be used on rocky or hill pastures that cannot be plowed. The current year's growth may be killed by one application of 8 oz. of 2,4-D acid per acre in late July or early September. To kill the roots, however, several treatments of 16 oz. of 2,4-D per acre must be applied. Mowing, of course, will prevent seeds from ripening. It should be remembered that these rates of 2,4-D will also kill clovers and alfalfa, although the grasses will be unharmed. It is practical to spray these weeds, therefore, only when they are present in pure or nearly pure grass stands.
