They caused over 7,000 accidents in Ontario last year because they didn't leave a safe stopping distance between cars.

Safe stopping distance is at least one car length between your car and the one ahead for every 10 miles of speed. At 60 miles an hour you should be six car lengths behind the car in front of you.
