Covered Bridges Still Around

In parts of New Brunswick province, on Canada's Atlantic coast, you will find "kissing bridges" on the lesser used highways.

In other parts of Eastern Canada, they are known simply as covered bridges, but in New Brunswick, the rustic, covered wooden structures also give young lovers a chance to do a little kissing away from adult eyes.

That was in the horse and buggy days, but some of the bridges may still provide privacy these days.

Retain Memories
In parts of Ontario, Quebec and New Brunswick, quite a few covered bridges are still in use. Historical societies and local people are making an effort to retain these memories of the past, even when the bridges need considerable repair. Not long ago near Sherbrooke, Quebec, highway authorities decided to preserve, rather than tear down, one of these old bridges on a little used road.

In New Brunswick, there are some 300 covered bridges in good shape and easily approached from main highways. Not far from the International boundary with the State of Maine at Hartland, N.B., is the world's longest covered bridge, about a quarter of a mile long. It crosses the St. John River, close by the Trans-Canada Highway, which was officially opened only last year.

Road Protection
Covered bridges were designed to protect the flooring and heavy timbers from the roting effects of sun and rain — not to keep the snow off the bridge floor. In fact, during the winter months snow was spread on the bridge floors to make travel by sleigh easier.

In the peaceful days of the horse and buggy, local merchants often took advantage of the immediate entrances of the covered bridges to advertise horse liniment, harness, horse blankets and buggy whips. Some of these advertisements can still be seen faintly.

Near Hillsborough, on Highway 14, is the Hartley Steeves bridge across Weldon Creek. It is one of the smaller of the covered bridges, and is on the Salem Road. It is only 63 feet long and 18 feet wide. When engineer John Forbes built this bridge in 1923, he met a pretty young local girl and married her. The bridge is still known as the "Dan Cupid" bridge.

Six in Camp
Near the entrance of Fundy National Park in the southern end of New Brunswick, at Alma on Route 14, is another. This one consists of three spans across the Salmon River. There are six covered bridges in the big Canadian Army camp at Gagetown on the St. John River.

Covered bridges in Quebec province are of various designs, sometimes more ornate than those still in existence in New Brunswick. But like those in the smaller province, they also cross rivers which provide good trout, and sometimes salmon, fishing. So if you are hunting covered bridges, bring your fishing tackle along and obtain a provincial license.

In Ontario there is one covered bridge with windows across the Grand River near West Montrose off King's Highway 40. The centre of the bridge rests on a concrete pier the shore ends on concrete abutments. It is a quiet rural area where the slow moving Grand River is well stocked with bass and trout.

42 Accidents in Aug. Damage is \$22,340
