Right to Kelo
Troquois Bruce Trail Club was formed at Hamilton on September 5, 1943, to build and maintain the trail from Grimsby through Hamilton to Kelo Conservation Area. Other objectives are building side trails where necessary; establishment and maintenance of campsites and shelters; a program of hikes for members; promotion of conservation, nature appreciation and preservation of historical sites. This program tends toward a better understanding of the area which will be more accessible through the trail.

Plan Camps, Shelters
In the future, however, it is a task that goes beyond the financial resources of the group that has already contributed so freely of their time and money. Building and equipping campsites and shelters will involve a considerable capital expenditure. Again, it is intended to keep this as a purely volunteer effort. This means that financial help will be welcomed from those people who agree that this is a very worthwhile project indeed. From the Hamilton Naturalists' Club has come a very much appreciated donation of \$50.

Membership is \$5.00 for one adult or for one family. Student membership is \$2.00; youth organizations \$5.00; adult organiza-

tions \$10.00. Fees are payable annually and the membership year begins on April 1. If a donation is made, a receipt will be supplied. Cheques should be made payable to Troquois Bruce Trail Club and sent to P.O. Box 183, Hamilton, Ont.

With the club just a year old, the program ahead is one that has to be realized in careful steps; it is a program that assumes the help and membership of many more people, an assumption justified by the great contribution the club has already made to the community and the province.

Roll call was "Your parents' birthplace." After the secretary's and treasurer's reports were read, business was discussed — fall fairs, short course etc.

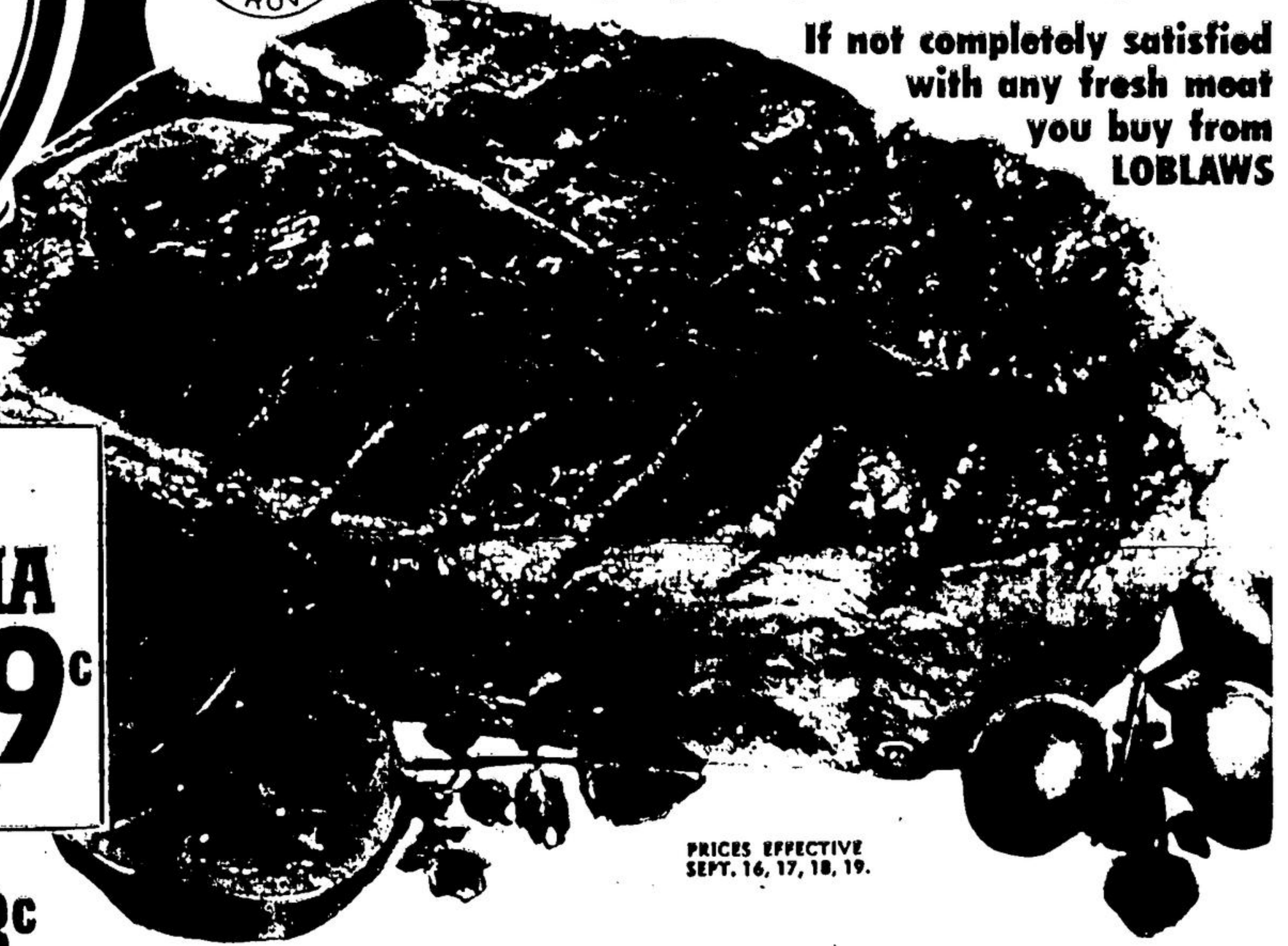
