**Hallon on New Map Covering Horseshoe**  
Release of a new county road map covering seven counties in what is often described as the Golden Horseshoe area of Ontario, was announced today by Hon. Charles MacNaughton, Minister of Highways.

The new, lithographed map combines several smaller county maps issued in recent years. The map contains the counties of Halldmand, Halton, Lincoln, Peel, Welland, Westnorth and York.

Distinctive features of the map include all roads in the area — King's Highways, county and township — lot and concession numbers and built up areas. It may also be useful to hunters. Although the map takes in about one-eighth of the area of the province, it covers almost half of Ontario's population.

The map is drawn to a scale of four miles to the inch. It is available from the Map Office, Department of Highways, Downsview P.O., at a cost of 60 cents plus sales tax.
