Fire Bureau's Yule Message

Christmas season is here and you and your family will soon be selecting Christmas trees for the festive season.

Make sure the tree you buy is a fresh pine. When you select your tree, feel the needles. If the tree is fresh, they will be firmly attached. Avoid the tree with needles which drop off when brushed.

Eliminate the possibility of your tree drying out before Christmas by keeping it outdoors until the day you decorate it. You can help keep the tree fresh by standing it in a pan of water.

Remember to reduce your chances of a Christmas tree fire by placing the tree in the coolest part of the room. Keep it away from radiators, heaters, and the fireplace. Keeping your tree from heat not only reduces the chances of fire but helps to keep it from drying out.

Remember to start until the day before Christmas before setting up your tree. A dry tree can be reduced to ashes in 18 seconds, so don't take any unnecessary chances by bringing it into the house too early.

Your Christmas tree should be placed in the type of stand which has a water container in which the trunk rests. Trees stay fresh by "drinking" a substantial amount of water. Refill the container daily.

Choose only flameproof decorations for your tree. You should use only decorations made of glass, metal or fire resistant material.

Handle your Christmas lights with care. Before placing them on the tree, check wires and sockets. Light sets with frayed wires should be discarded.

Remember, if possible, the switch controlling the tree lights should be some distance from the tree. This will reduce the chance of a spark from the electrical switch igniting the tree decorations.

In homes where an electric train is part of the Christmas display, tracks should be set up away from the tree. Toy trains sometimes throw off sparks, and sparks are a fire hazard.

Someone should be assigned the task of making sure that the lights on the Christmas tree are turned off at bedtime or when no one is near the tree.

Trees should be checked frequently for dryness. And check the needles next your lights — if they become dry and brittle, change the position of the light. If needles all over the tree start falling, discard the tree at once.

Metal trees should never be decorated with Christmas lights. The Fire Prevention Bureau suggests that off tree lighting gives a safer and more attractive decoration.

Always pick up gift wrappings immediately when Christmas presents are opened. The wrappings should be gathered up right away and placed in a metal waste container.

Some people like to keep their trees throughout the holiday season. But even if the tree appears fresh, take it down before it dries out.

Pictures for Your Christmas
