Acton Mixed

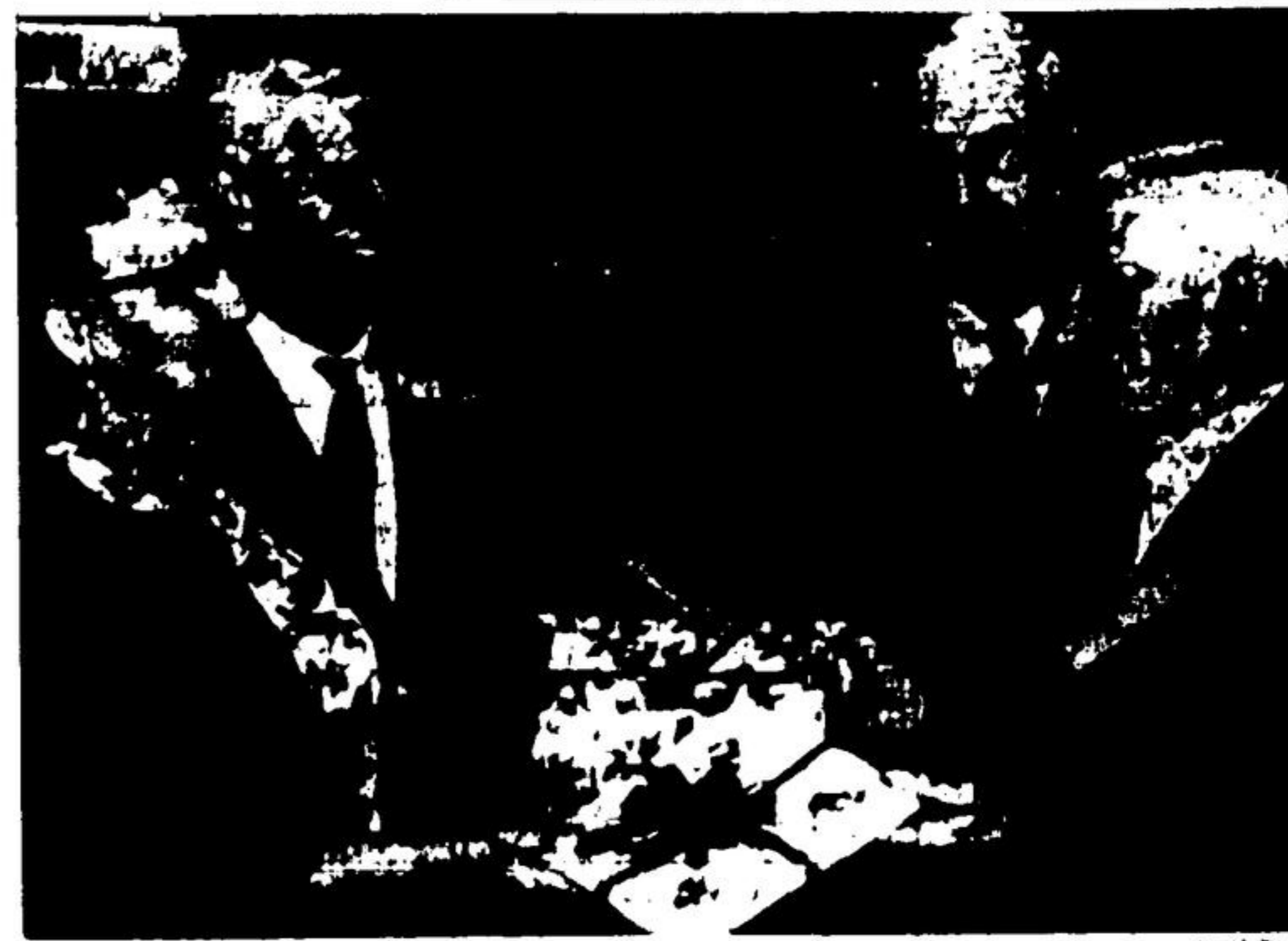
