Mr. and Mrs. Harvey Walters attended the funeral of their son, Mr. Ernest H. Edwards, at Beaverton on Monday, December 21.

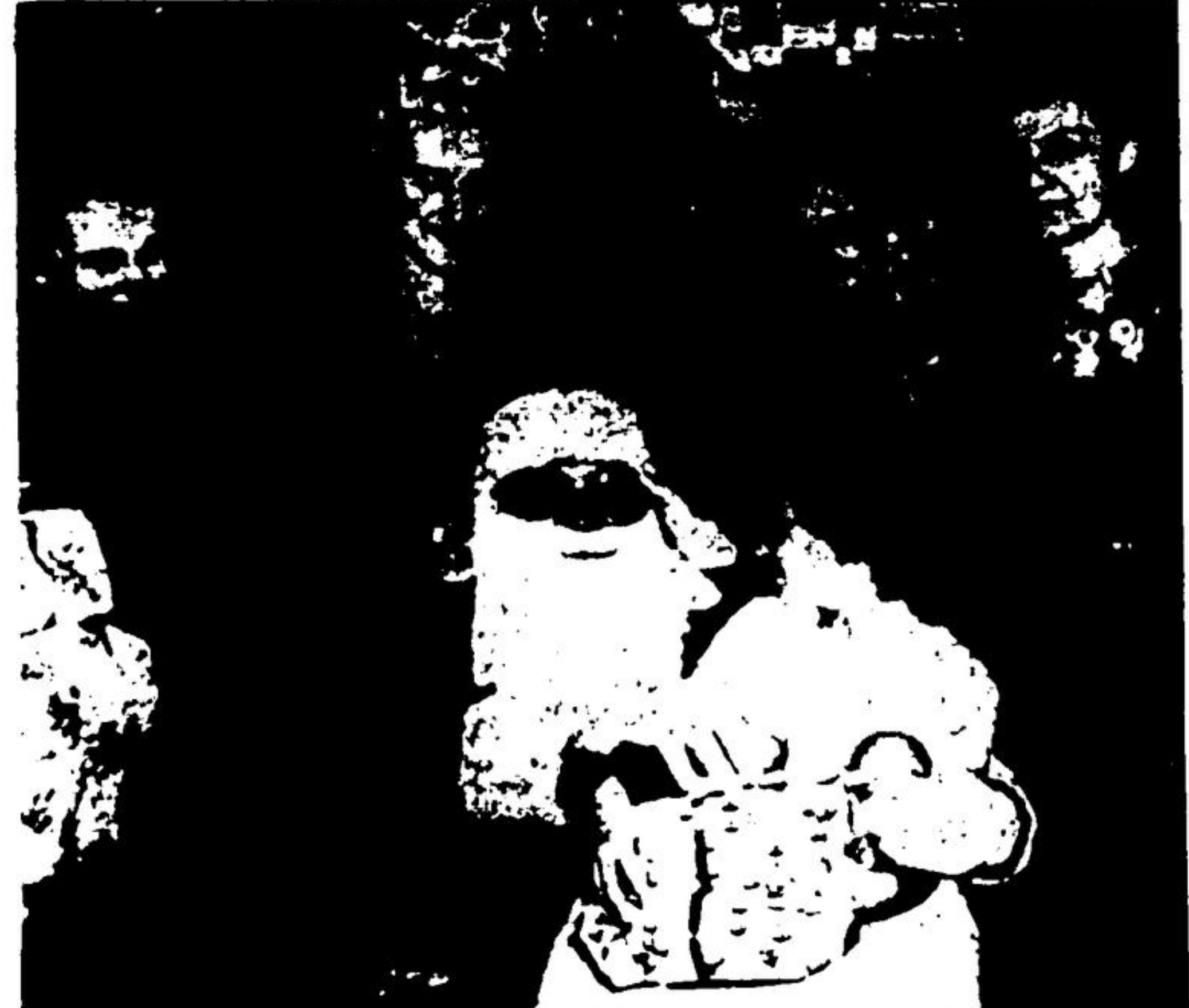
