

## Reports, Elections, Budget At United Annual Meeting

Annual reports, elections and acceptance of a budget of over \$23,000 were on the agenda at the annual meeting of Trinity United Church, which drew over 50 to the chapel Wednesday evening of last week. Chairman was the minister, the Rev. Dwight Engel and secretary M.M. A. Long.

The budget includes \$20,431 for specific local expenses.

Reports were received from representatives of 11 groups. Mrs. Long reported for the official board. Ken Allen for the trustees recommended money be set aside each year for maintenance. Mr. Engel reported for the session and Bill Coats for the committee of stewards.

Mr. Engel read Hugh Patterson's Sunday School report, commenting that due to the new curriculum, there has been an initial heavy investment in books. There are 137 registered and attendance is 65 per cent—an increase. There is a staff of 20.

## Vestry Meeting Sunday At St. Alban's Church

There were 32 in attendance at the annual vestry meeting of the Church of St. Alban the Martyr Sunday evening.

Church officers named are rector's warden Reg Hoare, people's warden Ted Pratt, advisory committee Sam Snow, Tom Lynch, Frank Van Wick, Vic Bristow, J. Graham, J. Rol and S. Newton.

Lay delegates are W. Denny, G. Lee and G. Gold. Treasurer is Harold Denny. Auditors will be appointed by the rector.

Harold Denny reported for each church.

Year's Statistics  
During the year the rector, the Rev. Donald West, officiated at 15 baptisms, 13 marriages and nine burials. Attendance has increased during the past year from 7,120 in 1963 to 8,715. Total number of communicants during 1964 was 4,135—up from 3,535 in 1963.

Coffee and cookies were served after the meeting by ladies of the church.

In his vestry address, Rev. West reminded members of St. Alban's that bare statistics and financial statements fall short of revealing the immeasurable, un-spectacular work and effort of priest and people who in their human way, try to serve the Lord.

The rector reported that 1964 reflected a "most satisfactory improvement in most areas of our parish life."

By special mention, Mr. West acknowledged the work of Reg Hoare, rector's warden; the late Bill Sproston, people's warden until his death; "the welfare of his parish was always his bidding concern and he has been greatly missed."

Mr. West continued: "We lost another good friend and faithful churchman in the death of Mr. G. Osmond Oakes, who served the church as lay delegate to

both the synods of Quebec and Niagara. We would all do well to follow his example in the same devotion he accorded the true Christian and a fine gentleman."

The rector paid tribute to the work of church treasurer, Harold Denny; Jack Creevey, envelope secretary; Mrs. Kenneth Fryer, vestry clerk; organist, Mrs. Frank Oakes and the choir, to member of all church groups, Mrs. Cecel Nelles and John Turner; George Haggett and sidesmen of the parish; members of the advisory board and lay delegates.

Rector's Address  
In his address, Mr. West said, "We must recognize and view with alarm, the decline in the church's influence upon society, and upon the morals of its people. More and more people are choosing to abandon, in a thoughtless fashion, the moral and spiritual guideposts and precepts which alone can give strength and energy to society. Already we can see the consequences of this abandonment in the moral and spiritual confusion which is besetting society in almost every level."

"In the midst of these morally perplexing times, we must realize that Christianity is a way of life which must be lived sacrificially and dynamically. It takes a courageous, stubborn man to live a full Christian life today... we who take our religion seriously must resist the temptation to become discouraged and disillusioned."
