## S. A. Captain Tells County Unwed Mothers Increase

An increasing number of unwed mothers are in their teens, Captain King of the Salvation Army told members of Halton County Council at their regular meeting as he lodged his appeal for an increased grant toward the Army's work.

Captain King reviewed the operation of the Grace Haven Home and Hospital for unmarried mothers. He noted the home admitted 175 girls in 1964, with 125 or eight from Halton. This represented an increase of 50.

The appeal for a grant was referred to the finance committee.

## Oakville Firefighter Chairman Halton Fire Prevention Bureau

Lt. Wm. Miller of Oakville Fire Department was re-elected Chairman of the Halton County Fire Prevention Bureau for 1965 at the Bureau's recent election. Lt. Miller was chairman for part of 1964 following the resignation of Acting Deputy Chief Bill Williams from the post.

Harold Coulson of Milton Fire Department was named vice-chairman, with Burlington Fire Department's Bob Gray as secretary and Harry Wilson of Oakville returned as treasurer.

The Bureau, which organizes fire prevention programs on a

county-wide basis and is made up of representatives of Halton's five fire departments, holds monthly meetings in Milton.

1965 include: Literature, Chief Douglas Wilson of Oakville; public relations, Chief A. E. Clement of Milton; Inspections, Chiefs Ervin Lewis of Georgetown and M. Holmes of Acton; posters and trophies, Glen Stringer of Milton; Christmas fire safety, District Chief George Wright of Oakville.

An auditing committee was named, including R. Baker, District Chief Wright and Captain Don

Miller.
