Donis Moffat, Sue Ward, Jean Anne Bowley and Carol Freeman sang "Love to Love" as a quartet.

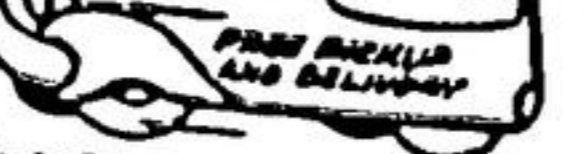

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## Mrs. Roy Coulter New Director Ontario Farm Safety Council

Mrs. Roy Coulter, Campbellville R.R. 3, was chosen as a Director of the Farm Safety Council of Ontario, at their annual meeting held at the O.A.C., University of Guelph, on February 2.

Mrs. Coulter has represented the Halton Co-Op Medical of the Halton Farm Safety Council, since the organization of this council in 1960. During the past year, she has been president of the Halton Council. As a Director from Zone 4, she will be representative of the eight counties in this area.

One of the outstanding speakers at this meeting was Rev. I. P. Adair, of St. Mark's Unity Church, Peterborough, discussing "The Farmer Image". He stated that it is time that all farmers united, and with one voice demand a far standard of living.

He stressed the importance of a businesslike attitude and appearance of farmers. He questioned the need for several farm organ-

izations, but stated that farmers should be organized, similar to the labor union. In the afternoon program an excellent panel was conducted on Traffic Safety projects. It was revealed that 19.3 per cent of all accidents occur on highways, with some 1,400 people killed each year. One third of highway accidents occur to those 16 to 24 years of age. Driver instruction is being carried on in 105 schools in Ontario, to train these young people in proper driving.

Our senior citizens are another area of safety concern. Although they account for only eight per cent of the population in Ontario, 40 per cent of traffic deaths occur in this age group.

The numerous films, publications etc. available on all phases of safety were discussed. Information on these can be obtained at the Agricultural Office.

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
