**Net Income**  
Net income of Bell for the year ended December 31, 1964, was \$77.7 million, equivalent to a return of 6.3 per cent on total capital, or \$2.71 per share. This compares with a rate of return of 6.1 per cent and earnings per share of \$2.58 in 1963.

After payment of \$2.20 per share in dividends to the company's 207,000 shareholders, the balance of 51 cents per share was added to earnings retained and invested in the business, according to the report. Of Bell's shareholders, 97.4 per cent live in Canada and own 93.6 per cent of the stock.

Contracts negotiated late in 1963 with three unions representing 28,700 employees increased payroll expense by about three per cent on an annual basis. As of December 31, Bell employed 35,890 men and women. The company's payroll in 1964 totalled \$187,081,086.
