

### Third U.C.W. Presbyterial Attended by 300 Delegates

Port Nelson United Church, Burlington, hosted the third annual meeting of Halton Presbyterial Church Women on Wednesday, March 3. Approximately 300 delegates representing 46 local assemblies for the morning session Mrs. Earl Sovereign, Presbyterial president, and Mrs. M. C. Lowe, President of Port Nelson, extended greetings of welcome and Mrs. Frank Taylor, Hamilton Conference president, conducted the worship service using the theme "For the Love of Christ Controls Us", reading the 4th Chapter of 1st John.
