ROP Tests

A program of increased service to dairy farmers testing their cattle under the federal Record of Performance plan was announced today by the Canada Department of Agriculture.

Additional inspectors are being hired to eliminate waiting lists and delays in taking on new applicants. ROP inspection will ensure that each herd will receive a minimum of 10 tests each year.

Frequent herd testing will mean that official Canadian records will continue to enjoy their high international reputation and provide an important selling point for Canadian dairy cattle in the international market.

At the same time the Department announced certain changes in the ROP rules and fee schedule.
