### At Kelso Hint Price Increase

There was a hint of increased admission prices for Kelso Conservation Area, at last week's meeting of the Halton Region Conservation Authority.


Members discussed increasing or changing admission charges to keep more in line with other conservation parklets, and to help cover a \$9,000 deficit on park maintenance costs incurred last year. Several ideas were discussed — including maintaining the per-car charge at the gate and adding a separate price for swimmers; simply upping the per-car price and changing the entrance way so museum visitors would only pay once if they just wanted to visit the Museum. It was left with the Conservation Areas committee to bring in a recommendation.

Poor Roads

During the discussion, member George Atkins jokingly suggested a "flood control plan" was needed on the Kelso roadways, as they were in "absolutely shameful condition" following the recent spring runoff period.

It was announced later in the meeting the Authority had purchased 25 pheasants at \$75 to keep for breeding stock on one of the Conservation Areas as a wildlife project.

Authority fieldman Dave Murray was authorized to negotiate for some property adjoining the Mount Nemo scheme, and to speak at a Burlington Council meeting concerning the Rambo and Hager Creeks flood control plan.
