Falls Through Ice—Deer Drowns Friday Apparently trying to evade a chasing dog, a deer raced across ice on Fairy Lake Friday morning, crashed through a thin spot and drowned... Mrs. Charles Landborough, a Lake Avenue resident, was alerted by her son and watched the deer thrashing in the water above the point at the park toward the old radial bridge area... At first she believed it was two dogs and one had fallen into the water. Her daughter Joanne took a pair of field glasses, went to the end of the park and saw it was a deer wallowing in the water... Police were notified and after attempting to procure someone with a boat had given up any attempt to save the deer as the ice was too thick to break a passage through by boat and too thin to walk on safely... The lake is still heavily iced and the deer is still in the water... Lawn Care Now is the time to clean up the lawn, say horticulturalists with the Ontario Department of Agriculture. As soon as the ground has dried off so that there is no danger of compaction, the lawn may be raked lightly... Rake off dead leaves, twigs, stones and other debris. To avoid pulling grass plants out by the roots, use a light spring rake rather than a heavy steel rake. Do not rake out all the dead grass since it will soon rot and add a little humus to the soil... A light rolling will firm the soil around grass roots which have been lifted by the freezing and thawing action of winter. Rolling will also help level the lawn and facilitate mowing. Care should be taken that soil conditions are suitable when rolling. If the soil is too wet, compaction and loss of porosity will occur, and if it is too dry the purpose of rolling will not be accomplished. One rolling in early spring should be sufficient for the year... Fertilizer may also be applied before active growth begins to avoid danger of burning. Use special turf fertilizer and apply at rates recommended by the manufacturer.

No Solution Yet To Hill Washout Following the sudden flood a few weeks ago which washed out most of the fourth line hill in Esquewing township, engineers from the Department of Highways have been on the scene trying to find a proper solution for repair and prevention of future flooding... The winding hill which abuts a steep hill on one side was washed out to a depth of about six feet and some trees on the side of the hill toppled. Meanwhile the road is closed until a suitable solution is decided... Township road superintendent Bud Snow and his crew are busy repairing other roads affected by heavy as well as grading roads.

Masson P.C. Candidate W. Coulter Loses Vote Oakville's popular Mayor Allan M. Masson was chosen as Halton's new Progressive Conservative candidate, when over 400 county conservatives attended one of the quietest Halton nomination meetings on record in Milton Friday... He called for a Halton party reorganization, noting he was only "the ship in the convoy carrying your cargo" and it would take the work of each and every P.C. to elect him to office... "I certainly cannot do it alone... my strength lies with you... I'll need your support if you expect this seat to be taken back in the next election..." **Lost by Beat** Halton's federal seat was Conservative for several years, and was won by Liberal Dr. Harry Harley in 1962 from former M.P. Sandy Bell... Later, Bill Coulter pledged his support for the candidate and asked that the vote be declared "unanimous" for Mr. Masson... **Guest speaker Friday was New Brunswick M.P. Gordon Fairweather**, who reviewed the scandals of the Pearson government and called Pearson's "60 Days of Decision" something that turned into "Two Years of Indecision..." **Plays Government** He referred to Hal Banks, Lucien Rivard, the "budget flavo," the pension squabble, the furniture and race-track deals, and as cited the Minister of Justice of "lack of competence and gross ineptitude." The Liberals, he noted were having a "Las Vegas Night" in Oakville on the same evening, and "the gambling motif is fairly evident in some of the legislation lately." Then he added, "The Liberals might have a birthday cake at their two-year birthday party that evening but "one of the candles has fizzled out and the other is sputtering..." "I didn't come to cynically catalogue the failure of the government," he said, "the Conservative party has done much for Canada. We look forward to a greater tomorrow and it's not what we are against, but what we are for that counts..." He was introduced by George Kerr and thanked by Halton P.C. president John Depew, who conducted the meeting. Doug Latimer of Georgetown was returning officer for the vote, and his assistants were Terry Baines, W. Sharpe, Dave Thompson and Louis Keane... Electric home heating continues to gain in popularity. At the beginning of 1965, some 13,000 residential installations had been completed.

Active Worker Mr. Masson spent four years on Oakville council before being elected Mayor less than a year and a half ago. He has spent most of his life (with the exception of a brief period as an R.C.A.F. pilot during the second world war) working in finance companies and in 1952 he founded Independent Finance in Oakville where he remains as president today. Mayor Masson has been active in other municipal life, including Chamber of Commerce, Red Cross, United Appeal, St. John's United Church and several sailing and social clubs... The winner's nomination was moved by friends William Hourigan of Burlington and Reeve Dr. C. A. Martin of Milton. Reeve Coulter was nominated by Arthur Gibson and A. Roy Coulter... In his speech to the meeting, Mayor Masson told the meeting "Halton needs more positive representation than it has had in the past two terms in Ottawa." He predicted the Liberals would present an "election insurance budget" this week by giving tax cuts to ensure their return to office, and warned it was better to "pay your bills and live within your income - it's not good to pay out more than you have, and let someone else look after it..."
