**Judge Best Fleeces At Sheep Club Meet**

The four fleeces of the 411 Sheep Club, judged to be best by Joe Willmott were sent to Canadian Co-operative Wool Growers Ltd. following a competition held during the regular monthly meeting of the Sheep Club last week.

Club members also planned a June 29 trip to a woolen mill and the Canadian Co-operative Wool Growers Ltd. building in Weston, where they will see the various processes in wool production.

During the meeting, the members discussed common wool terms such as crutling, sealing, silk and carpet wool as outlined in the publication, "Wool Production in Canada."

Borg M. Dennell, assistant agricultural representative, led a discussion on wool characteristics including fineness, weight, length, strength, crimp which is the natural waviness, color, felting properties and elasticity of fibres.

### Three Ton of Gold, Lifetime Production For Ken Ella Herd

In the herd of Kenneth Ella and Sons, Hurdley, three Jersey cows have been awarded a Ton of Gold certificate. Rock Ella Sporting Diane 232046, Supreme Excellent, produced in 1,428 days 2,053 lbs. of fat. Diane is also winner of three Silver Medals, two Gold Medals, two Ton of Gold certificates and is a daughter of the Senior Superior Sire, Lindale Aid na Lad, 117116.

Rock Ella Audna Beula 243765, Very Good, produced in 1,461 days 2,167 lbs. of fat. She is also a winner of three Silver Medals, one Gold Medal, one Ton of Gold certificate and is a daughter of the Senior Superior Sire, Lindale Aid na Lad, 117116.

Rock Ella Dreamer's Standees, 269221, Supreme Excellent, has just been awarded both a Life Time Production certificate and a Ton of Gold certificate. For a Ton of Gold she produced in 1,470 days 2,202 lbs. of fat. For a Lifetime Production she produced in eight lactations 78,889 lbs. of milk 4,586 lbs. of fat. She is also a winner of one Silver Medal, two Gold Medals, another Ton of Gold, and she is a daughter of the Superior Sire, Valleyanna Design Dreamer, 122127.

To qualify for a Ton of Gold certificate, a cow must produce at least 2,000 lbs. of fat in four consecutive years.

**Foresee Pine Forest From Alton Planting**

Workers of the Credit Valley Conservation Authority recently completed planting 100 acres of rock and hills at Alton with white and red pine seedlings which should cover the terrain with a pine forest in a few years.

Last year part of the property, owned by Jim Duddy, was hand-planted in the most inaccessible places with 30,000 trees. These trees are growing well and this year the rest of the property is being planted with machines.

From the top of the hill, the village of Alton nestles in the over valleys like toy homes. Two dams which supply power for the village's main industry also provide scenic lakes in which fish abound.

More than 400,000 trees will be planted under the reforestation assistance program of the Credit Valley Conservation Authority before the season is over. With orders piling up, the Authority is supervising Peter Shomper, R. R. 3, Orangeville, who is planting 200,000 trees for Telephone City Gravel Co., who own 1,000 acres between the Fifth Line of Caledon Township and the 10th Line of Elgin Township.

This company, English owned with headquarters in Bramford, has long range plans to reforest all of the property over the next two years. Another property recently reforested is the Taylor farm on 27 Sideroad at the Fourth Line, Chinguacousy Township.

The executive committee is composed of these chairman plus Authority chairman McMullan and vice-chairman Eric White.

The Credit Valley Conservation Authority has, since its inception, and with the cooperation of the municipalities in the valley, curtailed building on floodland; promoted a floodline survey available to public and private land owners; helped finance the riprap walls of the river at Port Credit; cleared the river of the dangerous hydraulic obstructions at Erindale; built weirs to prevent erosion; and initiated a sanitary land fill project.

Engineering surveys are now in progress along the river for flood control projects and channel diversions to prevent a recurrence of the flooding earlier this spring.

Seemingly insurmountable problems of flood control are gradually being cleared up and a far-sighted look at the future shows that aims of the CVCA have not been changed. To improve and preserve the Credit Valley in the best possible condition for future generations.
