Our examination has been conthicked he accordance with the auditing instructions of The Deportment of Municipal Affairs and there is attached a completed questionnaire covering this.

The statement of Revenue and Expenditure "D", shows to Finesphes on the year's operations of \$14,688.33. A detailed comparison of the palms and loubes from the budget figures is attached, showing how the surplus accurred.

At the end of the year, the Town of Acton had a loan of \$201,700.00 cutstanding. This money has been borrowed by the Yowr and funds advanced to the Acton District High Echael to provide funds for a new high school addition. Debentures for this addition will be issued in 1965 and the loan repaid.

The Town has also entered into an arrangement to purchase land for industrial purposes, and at December 31, 1964 had made a deposit of \$1,000.00 on the land. Approval has been obtained for the tame of debentures for this purpose and debentures in the minorate of \$30,000.00 are to be issued dated December 31, 1964.


