We should therefore look after that percentage of 17% who do not have, cannot qualify, or cannot afford Medicare. The Government feels that it is not necessary to disrupt or cancel existing plans which are working well and which in many cases are part of labour-management agreements whereby management pays part of the employee's premium. It also refers to certain rural coops such as the Halton County Co-Operative Medical Services as providing adequate coverage at low cost to its subscribers.

The Government Party is the Progressive conservative Party and basically opposes compulsion. Premier Robarts has emphasized that if the government's plan docs not work, if people who require insurance are not being protected. the necessary changes will be made. The insurance carriers and the medical profession have an opportunity to prove that a voluntary plan will work. It it doesn't, within a year drastic changes will be made.

The premier has pointed out that the Hall Commission report volving hospital care and facilities, nursing colleges, medical schools, clinics, doctors and all the personnel and facilities required to maintain a high level of health care. The Provincial Government within one month of the publication of the Hall report, implemented a construction crash program to provide these facilities and personnel and we will be ahead of the deadline by at least a year for Ontario's
