Beginning next month, we are to get the benefit of the .10 per cent reduction in personal Income taxes which Finance Minister Gordon announbed in his recent budget. Even so, federal tax revenues this year will in all probability be higher than in any previous year. And so, we can be sure, will federal expenditures.

Yet it is of some interest to note that Ottawa is not responsible for most of the government spending in Canada today, nor has it been for some time past. Last year, for example, the provinces and municipalities between them spent more than \$8 billion, compared with \$6.5 billion spent by Ottawa.

The rate of increase over the past 10 years as between the various levels of government is even more revealing.

Total spanding by the three levels of government increased by exactly 100 per cent between 1935-1964, while the gross visitional product the sum total of goods and services produced annually - rose by just 73 per cent. (These are unadjusted figures and do not take into account higher prices.)

But when this 100 per cent increase in government spanding is broken down, federal expenditures can be seen to have climbed by 52 per cent compared with a rise of 172 per cent


