Pineview, Limehouse Schools To Have Two-Room Additions

Providing the Ontario Municipal Board and Department of Education give final approval, Enslaking school board will have two building programs underway this summer.

It is hoped that a two-room addition to the Limehouse school and a similar addition to the Pineview school will be completed for occupancy by September.

Nine tenders for the two building projects were studied at a board meeting Monday, July 5, and the J. B. Mackenzie and Son tender price of \$18,330 for the Pineview addition and the A. J. McCarthy tender amounting to \$42,249 for the Limehouse project were tentatively accepted by the board pending final approval. A total of four tenders were received for the Pineview job and five for the Limehouse project.
