### Induction on Sunday Of Rev. R. McMurray

At St. Alban's Acton, on Septem-  
ber 12, at 7 p.m., the Right  
Reverend C. R. H. Wilkinson,  
Assistant Bishop of the Diocese  
of Niagara, will induct the new  
rector "into the real, actual and  
corporal possession of this  
church, with all the rights, pri-  
vileges, and emoluments thereto  
belonging." The new rector will  
also receive a license from the  
bishop to function in the parish  
of St. Alban's with the words,  
"Receive this charge, which is  
mine and thine, in the name of  
the Father and of the Son and  
of the Holy Ghost."

The custom of inducting and  
installing a rector into his parish  
has a very ancient and color-  
ful history and received a great  
deal of attention during the In-  
stitution Controversy in the Mid-  
dle Ages. The ceremonies will  
close with prayers for the priest  
and people of the parish. The  
fisher prays God to make the  
people "to love thy Home, to aid  
thy priest, and to walk in fellow-  
ship one with another," and that  
He grant that the priest "may  
be a faithful dispenser of Thy

holy Word and Sacraments, and  
be a good example to the people  
committed to his charge."

The clergy of the Diocese of  
Wellington, as well as the vari-  
ous ministers and pastors of Ac-  
ton churches, will be present.  
The Venerable Stanley A. Kirk,  
Archdeacon of the area, will de-  
liver the address. The Reverend  
R. Porritt, acting Rural Dean,  
will read the License.

ception will be held for Bishop  
and Mrs. Wilkinson in the par-  
ish hall.
