Our Readers Write...

CITIZENS OF NARBAGAWA
 You have recently received notification of By-Law No. 1865 which has been passed by the Township Council after first, second and third readings on the 1st of August, 1965.

After giving the by-law careful study, you will realize the far-reaching effects that this by-law will have on the immediate future of our Township.

The by-law proposes, in substance to limit the sale of land to 25 acres but that is not all. There are far more serious aspects of this by-law which render it entirely unworkable, unrealistic and undemocratic. Following are some of the immediate developments resulting from this discriminatory by-law, the equivalent of which you will only find in countries like Russia, Cuba and China.

1. No existing building can be enlarged or its uses changed.
2. No lands can be sold unless the purchaser wishes to use such land for full time farming.
3. As the existing farms in this area are largely worked on a part-time basis, should they be sold, the new owners would be expected to maintain himself from what is now land which is non-agricultural. This would be a most adverse effect on the sale of any farm property in our Township.
4. No lots for city dwellers wishing to relocate in our Township would be available, thus causing stagnation and setting our Township back for an untold number of years.
5. Should any road or other improvements be made in the Township, all taxes
