Record Number Eligible To Vote in Halton Riding More than 66,000 Halton residents will be eligible to cast ballots in the November 8 federal election. The new total of 66,628 eligible voters was announced this week by returning officer Richard H. West of Burlington.

The new total represents an increase of 7,477 voters over the total for the last federal election and was much larger than the 4,000 increase which Mr. West had predicted.

The courts of revision for the November 8 election will be open on October 21, 22 and 23. The information on the advance poll locations, the revision offices and voter's lists will be sent to Halton householders later this month.

Proper Winter Storage Of Irrigation Equipment

Irrigation is now widely used for spring frost control, as well as for irrigation. If used for frost control, it will be needed well before regular irrigation is started. Nearly one-half of the growers in this area were caught with their irrigation systems out for repairs at the time of the last killing frost this spring.

The two main factors to consider when storing your irrigation system are: (1) to be sure no damage occurs during the winter, and (2) to see that it will be in operating condition when removed from storage in the spring.

The pump and pipes should first be drained of all water so that damage will not occur when the water freezes. Sprinklers and risers should be removed and stored separately, so that they are less likely to be damaged. The pipe should be stored flat. Bent pipe will remain bent.

Rodents have been known to chew and ruin rubber gaskets so it may be wise to remove these and store away from rodents.

Repairs should be made in the fall, so that everything is ready to go first thing in the spring. Engines should be cleaned up and repaired if necessary. Sprinklers should be checked, and if worn, they should be replaced.

Install New Sewer Precedes Building

On Wednesday Kiewitway Construction worked began installation of a sewer main extension in Lakeview subdivision at the far end of Tildy Ave. Installation of services and streets is to precede the construction of the additional houses in the area.
