One of the problems that faces a bridge player is playing a part score when dummy is short of entries. Often when you have an above average hand, partner has next to nothing! How should you handle these hands?

One rule that I have used over the years goes like this - "You don't have to take the first eight tricks - any eight will do." You can put in any number that you like for eight.

Here is a part score hand that occurred last week at the Acton Bridge Club. It gave a few declarers a rough time. This is Board No. 16.

LET'S PLAY BRIDGE

will probably lead another heart. If East plays the queen, declarer should win, cash the ace and king of trump and play another trump to saddle West with the lead again.

If East doesn't play the queen of hearts, declarer wins in dummy and takes a spade finesse. Now he can take his trump and put West in the lead with the fourth trump.

Almost in spite of themselves, East and West will help declarer by leading the side suits.

Notice what happens if South wins the second trick and tries to clear trumps. He will lose two trump tricks. If he leads a club to the king, he will not make a club trick since declarer cannot get to dummy himself, he may well lose another heart and a spade.

Remember, don't get too busy. You don't have to take the first eight tricks - any eight will do.
