Near 700 Cases of Grapes Sold To Local Amateur Wine-Makers

Sale of California grapes for winemaking in the Acton area appears to be increasing this year — at least as far as one local merchant is concerned. John Kurnlenko, manager of Acton's Red and White store, has sold close to 700 cases of grapes in the past two weeks, for wine-making purposes.

The first shipment which arrived at his store a week ago totalled over 450 cases. The shipment was previously ordered by customers and delivered within two hours after arrival.

Monday of this week, another shipment of 250 cases arrived from California and like the first, it was pre-ordered and delivered promptly.

New Popularity

Winemaking seems to be increasing across Canada. There are more than 12 amateur wine-making clubs. Wine-tasting and wine-and-cheese parties, relatively unheard of five years ago, have suddenly become popular.
