Halton Riding's member of parliament for the past two and one-half years, 39-year-old Dr. Harry Harky of Oakville will be seeking his third term in office when voters go to the polls on Monday.

The native of Weston, Ontarlo, will be out to gain his third consecutive victory since entering federal politics in 1962. In April of that year, the Oakville physician ousted the citting member. Progressive Conservative Sandy Best, by a slim margin of 96 votes. Less than a year later, he repeated the victory by rolling up a 9,533 vote plurality.


