

Many at Cenotaph Sunday For Remembrance Service

The new practice of holding the Remembrance Day service on the preceding Sunday, rather than on the exact date, continued the tradition with well-attended observances at Action and district cenotaphs and with special services in churches.

The memorial notes of the Last Post sounded at Action's cenotaph before a large crowd of paraders and cheering spectators. The parade to the Hill St. monument began about 10:30 a.m. and included many veterans in Legion uniforms, Legion Ladies Auxiliary members, Cub Scouts, the mayor, town council, and members of council, Cub Guides and Brownies and token representation from various other organizations.

Parade marshal was Legion president Jim Gunn, who gave the Legion charge. John McHugh read the names from the scroll.

Heads bowed, four killed members of the Town Scots (including William Taylor and Patrick Dunn) were blanketed by the wreath.

The special poppy flag, temporarily replacing the Maple Leaf flag on the flagpole, was lowered at the notes of the Last Post by Dr. A. J. Buchanan and then slowly raised again as Reveille, as always stirred the hearts of the listeners. Frank Simons played the bugle. Flags of the color parties dipped and then flew high again.
