What about permanent disability? He's covered. Benefits in-

clude all medical expenses and pensions for permanent disability.

How about the worker's family? In death cases there are allowances for funeral expenses and pensions for widows and children.

Is this the same Workmen's Compensation that 2,000,000 men and women in other lines of work have protecting them? Exactly the same.

What about the Farmer? He and his wife also can be covered by Workmen's Compensation, by

making a special application to the Workmen's Compensation Board. And his Family? If they work on the same farm and get a stated wage, they are automatically covered, as is the Farm Employee.
