Lorne Colling and Dead Brush Wolf

Man Shoots 80 Pound Brush Wolf Three Sighted Near Pony Farm

An 80 pound brush wolf was shot in Nassagaweya Monday by Lorne Colling, on his farm north west of Campbellville. It was one of a pack of three sighted near his ponies.

Noticing the animal on a rise of land near the ponies, Mr. Colling got his gun and followed the three wolves across two fields on the downward side before lowering one with a shot from his 22.

The animal measured four and a half feet from the tip of the tail to his nose and resembled a police dog, with reddish black pelt.

Wolves are worth a \$25 bounty, which is shared at 60 percent by the county in which it was shot, and 40 percent by the Province.

Foliar Fertilizer Versus Years of Research

Foliar fertilizers have been and are being sold throughout Halton County for applications to grain and corn crops. This is occurring despite the many years of trials conducted across Ontario under the supervision of County Soil and Crop Improvement Association, Agricultural Schools and the Ontario Agricultural College, Guelph.

These trials have definitely shown that it is not practical to supply nitrogen, phosphorus and potassium to general grain crops through the leaves. No increase in yields of oats, barley, corn or potatoes resulted from one or several foliar spray applications.

However, substantial yield increases of these crops resulted when regular fertilizer was applied according to soil test. Salesmen convince farmers that foliar fertilizer will work miracles with pages of results taken by their company. The farmer must decide whether he will accept years of carefully conducted and statistically arranged trials by Soil and Crop Improvement Associations, and College personnel or discard this advice.

Liquid Application
These liquid fertilizers are also being sold to be applied as a liquid application to the seed at planting time. This may in most cases get the new plant off to a quicker start, but has not been found to be superior to similar amounts of the correct type of dry fertilizers applied with the seed. These dry fertilizers have the potash in a form which will not cause burning of the new seedlings.

The farmer must consider the cost of the fertilizer. If he does not, he is wiping out years of exposure to farm management.

The cost of foliar fertilizers are considerably more expensive than dry fertilizers. One gallon of 10-30-10 foliar fertilizer weighs approximately 14 lbs. Thus, one ton of this fertilizer would amount to 125 gallons. If the liquid cost \$275 per gallon, this would be a cost of \$34,375 per ton. Compare this to the dry fertilizer of the 10-20-10 analysis, which can be purchased today for approximately \$90 per ton. Can a farmer afford to pay one dollar more per ton for the same amount of fertilizer nutrients? Many liquid fertilizers for soil application are sold by the ton and are comparable in price to dry fertilizers.

Of Little Value
The salesman may say that these foliar fertilizers contain trace elements such as boron, zinc, manganese, magnesium and molybdenum. Are these trace elements necessary on your farm? The chances are very high that these trace elements are of little value and in some cases may cause decreases in yield.

Tests conducted across Ontario in 1965 by the Soils Science Department, University of Guelph, show that yield increases occurred on the same amount of fertilizer nutrients in Ontario, is available at the Agricultural Office. If you are asked to spend hard earned cash for foliar fertilizer read this publication, and look over the statements on foliar fertilizer in the 1964 and 1965 annual reports of the Halton Soil and Crop Improvement Association. You will make the correct decision.
