tance rates. Overlooked, too, was the fact that Acton has no hospital, that hospital cases have to be taken to Guelph; often in hurry, without the added assistance of a call in advance. Should a doctor wish to consult a surgeon in Guelph, with Acton on the same circuit, there would be no extra charge.

What has been said of Guelph is also true of Milton, though in lesser degree. I would feel that it one had to choose between the two, most citizens' would prefer Guelph. But if both could be made available, let us not be parochial - let us embrace the opportunity. The change of heart at RENT, TRADE the Acton Free Press is welcomed and is most gratifying.
