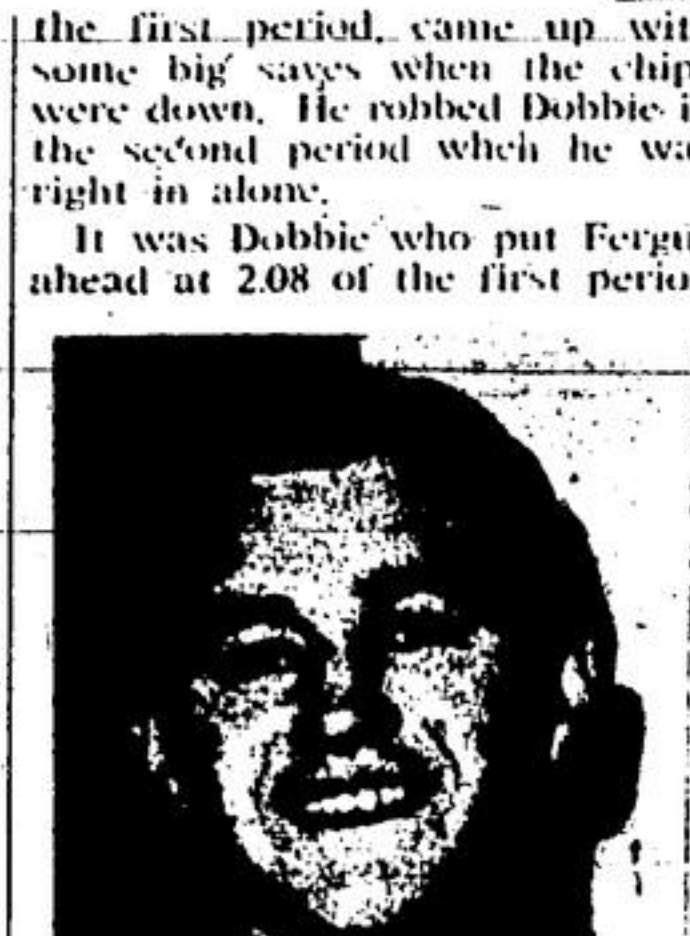
Dusters, Bushers Meet in Finals Industrial Loop

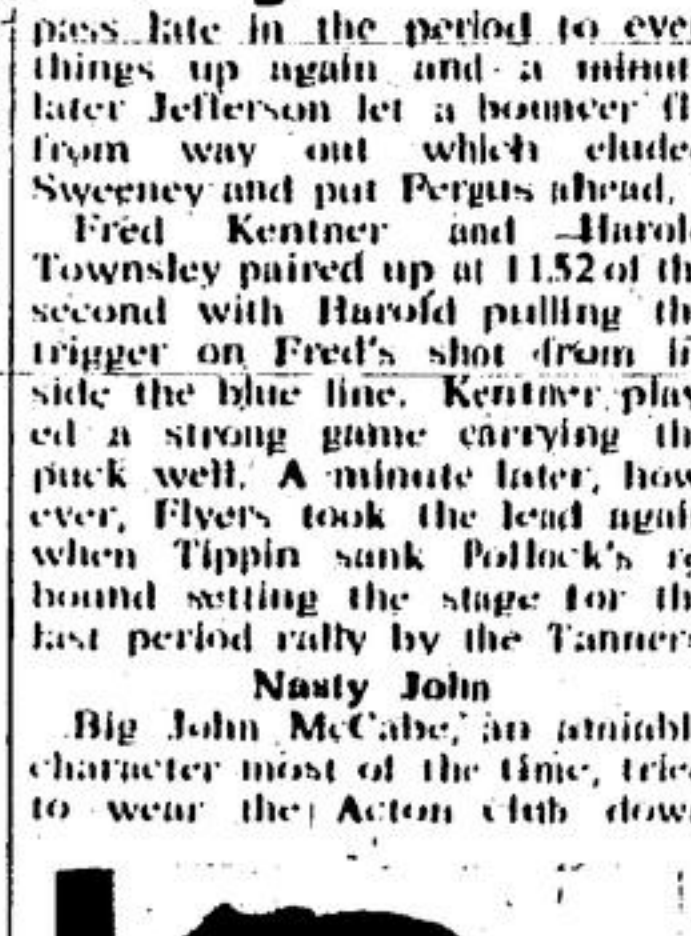
Haines Ties Knot
