Georgetown Jerseys Set March Records

During the month of March the highest record reported to the Canadian Jersey Cattle Club by the Record of Performance in Ottawa was that of Rosegate Charm 2, a daughter of Brampton Sonora's Radar, bred and owned by Mac Alexander, Norval. In 305 days, at eight years of age, this cow produced 15,296 lbs. milk, 761 lbs. fat, 4.98 per cent, winning a Gold Medal and Medal of Merit.

In the senior four-year-old class, Nurseland Fairnuse Connie, a daughter of Nurseland Lodge Generat'n Lad, tested by Mrs. S. L. Eva Harper, Georgetown, had the high record in the senior two-year-olds. Commencing at two years 230 days, in 305 days, she produced 9,595 lbs. milk, 525 lbs. fat, 5.47 per cent, a Silver Medal record.
