Quarries — where they operate, the effect they have on their neighbors and the ways in which they might be controlled - have been the most recent hot topic at council meetings.

Reeve William Coulter indicated, "I'll call a committee meeting of council, as long as every member is prepared to bring in constructive suggestions." It was assumed that at the committee meeting council would try to draw up points which they consider should be included in a new agreement between the quarry operators in the township and council.

Holes for Garbage

The depositing of waste into the large holes dug on quarry properties bothered Councillor Mrs. Anne MacArthur, and she suggested, "we should give some thought to this idea of throwing garbage in the holes. We want it done properly — not in a way that we'll have to suffer some nasty smell." She noted provisions should be made to have only "sanitary garbage" put into the holes, and indicated workers might have to be hired to make sure the quarries follow this procedure.

Clerk J. C. McIntyre stated "They waltzed us around the mul berry bush before and they'll try it again."

She continued, "we should be very careful about the rights we give quarries. In the past the bylaws have been changed to suit them." She said she referred to the distance of quarries from the road.

Reeve Coulter concluded the discussion on the topic by noting "an agreement would be more binding than a by-law, it wouldn't take as much time or money to administer."




