

Reward Four Fire Prevention Groups Fire Marshal Presents Certificates

Rewards for their fire prevention efforts during 1965 were received Saturday by members of the Halton County Fire Prevention Bureau and Oakville, Acton and Milton Fire Departments, during the annual banquet of Halton Mutual Aid at Milton Fire Hall.

Ontario Fire Marshal Martin S. Hurst attended to extend congratulations to the Mutual Aid and present the certificates on behalf of the National Fire Prevention Association. The N.F.P.A. organizes the annual competition for fire prevention agencies, and entries constitute scrapbook accounts of the fire bureau's or fire department's work.

Halton's Award
Reeve Gordon Gallagher of Burlington, representing Halton County Council, accepted the Halton Bureau's "special recognition" certificate for a year-round, county-wide fire prevention program.

Oakville Mayor MacLean Anderson accepted Oakville's award, representing a third prize in the Ontario division and an "honorable mention" for all of Canada, in the 25,000 to 100,000 population bracket.

Nassagaweya Councillors Touch on Quarry Topic

"The question of quarries still bothers me," Deputy Reeve William Hocy stated as he introduced the controversial topic of quarries at the regular monthly meeting of Nassagaweya Council.

Quarries — where they operate, the effect they have on their neighbors and the ways in which they might be controlled — have been the most recent hot topic at council meetings.

Reeve William Coulter indicated, "I'll call a committee meeting of council, as long as every member is prepared to bring in constructive suggestions." It was assumed that at the committee meeting council would try to draw up points which they consider should be included in a new agreement between the quarry operators in the township and council.

Holes for Garbage
The depositing of waste into the large holes dug on quarry properties bothered Councillor Mrs. Anne MacArthur, and she suggested, "we should give some thought to this idea of throwing garbage in the holes. We want it done properly — not in a way that we'll have to suffer some nasty smell." She noted provisions should be made to have only "sanitary garbage" put into the holes, and indicated workers might have to be hired to make sure the quarries follow this procedure.

Clerk J. C. McIntyre stated, "They waltzed us around the mulberry bush before and they'll try it again."

She continued, "we should be very careful about the rights we give quarries. In the past the by-laws have been changed to suit them." She said she referred to the distance of quarries from the road.

Reeve Coulter concluded the discussion on the topic by noting "an agreement would be more binding than a by-law, it wouldn't take as much time or money to administer."

Dump Problems
Discussions then shifted to the state of the Township dump, located in the north section of the Township. Councillor MacArthur stated she had received complaints indicating that bodies of dead animals — rats, dogs and deer — have been left uncovered in the dump. A township ratepayer in the gallery agreed with the statement.

Reeve Coulter said it would be expensive to pay someone to stay there to guard against the insects.
