FAME Shareholders To Lose Investment

Approximately 11,000 Ontario farmers who had \$144,287 invested in shares in FAME — Farmers' Allied Meat Enterprises — are expected to regain nothing on their investment, it was learned last week. Many of the FAME investors were Halton residents.

FAME declared bankruptcy and a creditors' meeting was held Thursday. It appeared all the farmers who bought shares in multiples of \$100 (one man had \$10,000 worth) faced a complete loss. FAME had liabilities totaling \$1,130,400 and assets of \$107,500 when it went bankrupt. Secured and preferred creditors and debenture holders in the cooperative have first claim.

Control Insects

Treat Corn Before Planting

Every Halton County farmer should treat his corn prior to planting, to control insects which may attack it before it emerges. Diazinon will control the seed maggot and Lindane will protect the seed against wireworms. These two insecticides can be purchased in a combined form from your local dealer. The required amount should be mixed with one-half pint of water for each bushel to be treated and the seed thoroughly wet with this mixture.

A similar treatment may be used for treating oats or barley to control wireworms. Other insecticides which can be used for seed treatment of cereal grains are 50 per cent aldrin, 50 per cent dieldrin, 50 per cent heptachlor, or 50 per cent lindane wettable powder at one ounce per bushel.

Where continuous corn is grown, corn rootworm may become a problem. The rootworm adult has been picked up in the Guelph area, but damage to the

corn crop has not been evident up to now. It is likely that the invasion of this insect will take place on a gradual basis. When there is evidence of this increase, treatment can be started. Band treatment of granular insecticide is recommended, placed in the

soil just above the seed. Until this starts to become a problem, the diazinon-lindane combination applied to the seed, should be satisfactory.
