## Fund Will Assist African Students

The Diocese of East Africa is in need of ald for the education of its youth. A sister Diocese, Niagara, has asked its parishes to consider this need seriously. St. Alban's, Acton, has begun a drive for funds to educate as many young people in East Africa as it can manage. The fund opened last Sunday, May 8.

The Rector reminded the parishioners in a letter that the meaning of "living on the right side of Easter" was to be found in mutual concern and effort for others. The Parish has already shown signs of its willingness to respond to real need when it is plainly placed before it. The plans are to undertake such, a fund every year during the season of Easter and Pentecost . . . the time when, after the Resurrection of Christ, the Church is sent out into the world to proclaim the Good News to free the slave, to sue for truth and peace, and to relieve those in need wherever they may be.

## Buy Park Land Puslinch Lake

Purchase of 123 acres of marginal land at Puslinch Lake to be used for public and recreational use was approved by the Grand Valley Conservation Authority.

Possible future land purchases are being considered and the authority is currently making land and water surveys in the lake

The authority and its nine-member municipalities will share the cost. Members include Guelph, Galt, Kitchener, Waterloo, Preston, Hespeler and the townships of North Dumfries, Puslinch and Waterloo.

A house standing on the property will be sold by the authority for \$12,000. Half of the remaining \$20,000 cost will be paid by the

government grants.

Another land purchase approved was for two 100-acre parcels of land belonging to Mr. and Mrs. H. Hortop of Everton, in Eramosa Township. The land on the Eramosa River would also be converted to public and recreational use by the authority

The authority will offer the Hostops \$85,000 for the property. An initial payment will be \$25,000 with a five-year mortgage on the remainder.

The meeting was the last official meeting of the authority. Legislation will be introduced in the Ontario Legislature that will amalgamate the authority with the Grand River Conservation Commission to create the Grand River Conservation Authority. The amalgamation is to be passed within a few weeks.

Approval has been received from the department of energy and resources management for the following contracts: \$45,553 for Mill Creek Dam, to Nadeco Ltd., of Rexdale; and \$10,545, drilling test surveys for the proposed West Montrose Dam, to Master Scale Investigations Ltd., of Tor-

The department also approved the following grants: \$3,600 for preliminary engineering work on the lower Whiteman Creek reservoir; \$16,775 for flood plain mapping; up to \$450 to complete preliminary engineering surveys on the Speed River; and \$71,800 for the laurel Creek reservoir pro-

The authority ordered liability insurance coverage increased from \$500,000 to \$1,000,000 in the event larger claims are made against the authority.

No action was taken by the authority on a petition for further salary adjustments until creation of the new authority, (GRCA) when the staffs of the authority and the Grand River Conservation Commission will be integrated.
