## Blacksmith shop opened at museum

After collecting dust for more than 20 years, a family blacksmith shop built about 1880 and in use until around 1940, has been restored on the Halton County Museum property.

The doors to the combination blacksmith shop and carpenter's workshop were opened to the public for the first time a week ago after months of restoration

The shop was built about 1880 by Adam Alexander for his own personal use, and he continued to use it until around 1940. The bellows and forge on display in the 28 by 14 foot enclosure are the originals and in addition there are an anvil and more than 250 other pieces of blacksmith's

Halton County Museum curator Major H. J. Newman reports it took a great deal of the winter to fix the large bellows, and he recalls it took nearly all of last summer to clean out the building.

The opening of the blacksmith's shop is regarded as a major addition to the museum and will be considered gallery three in the museum's overall

Major Newman described the forge as "one of the nicest I've ever seen" and said the huge slabs of stone used in the construction of the forge were taken from the nearby hillside. The forge, he said, weighs well over two tons.

The Halton County Museum won't officially be opened until July 1, 1967 but the curator says some special demonstrations might be arranged alate this vear. One of the possible demonstrations would consist of shoeing horses.
