hurt in accident

A Speciale woman and her teenage daughter were hospitalized Thursday afternoon of last week when their late-model car went out of control and slammed head-on into a tree on Highway 25 north of Five Sides.

Mrs. Sadie Kelly of RR #3 Milton, a resident of Milton District Hospital with head contusions and bruises to her knees, elbow and ankle as a result of the one-car accident. Her daughter, Doris Anne Kelly, had a fractured jaw, knee and bruises.

Police said the car, owned by Mrs. Kelly's son, Dennis, was being driven north on Highway 25 when it slid out of control about 420 feet north of the side road. It was raining heavily at the time. The car, a 1965 Dodge, was classed as a total wreck. Mrs. Kelly and her husband, Henry, operate the Speciale General Store on Highway 25 at 5 Sides.
